Additional Information: Goods that become subject to Biosecurity control continue to be subject to Biosecurity control until released from Biosecurity control. The importer and/or owner of the goods, subject to Biosecurity control are liable to pay any expenses connected with the inspection, transportation, storage, maintenance, treatment, movement, removal, disposal or destruction of the goods. In addition the Master, owner and/or agent of any conveyance under Biosecurity control, or directed to be treated are liable to pay the cost of piloting or towing the conveyance, removing things from the conveyance and treating the conveyance and goods on the conveyance or removed from it. If at the end of a period for which any goods have been isolated, a Director of Biosecurity is of the opinion that the goods cannot be released without an unacceptable high level of biosecurity risk, he or she may direct that the goods be secured in such a manner and for such further period as stated in the direction. A person is guilty of a criminal offence if he or she contravenes a Biosecurity officer's direction. If goods are moved or otherwise interfered with in contravention of the *Biosecurity Act 2015* they may be taken into control of the Commonwealth. The Commonwealth does not accept liability for damage which may occur as a result of any necessary treatment. If the person in charge' of goods has been notified that treatment may damage the goods, and the person in charge' does not, before the end of 30 days after the day on which the person in charge' receives the notice, give written notice to a Director of Biosecurity stating that they agree to the treatment, the goods may be taken into control of the Commonwealth. Any expenses of charges payable to the Commonwealth may be recovered by action in a court of competent jurisdiction as a debt due to the Commonwealth.
