





- technology.

The inquiry also considered competition as a driver of costs and efficiency




What have we heard?



Port performance - the world bank study

Average turnaround times, 2019-20




Australia's major container ports have poor average turnaround times.

But is this robust?

The ACCC and ESC have highlighted competition issues

We have heard that ports are regional monopolies but regulation is weak.



Specific competition issues raised with us:

TACs up to \$160 per container



 Claims that container detention fees are exploitative (detention fees can be \$300 a day)




Ongoing issue of Part X of the Competition and Consumer Act



Infrastructure issues raised with us:

- Will larger vessels be accommodated?
- Is increased rail desirable/economic investment?
- Are recent disruptions short or long term?
- Is long-term planning adequate?



Workplace arrangements


- ACCC (and others) concerned about content of enterprise agreements in container terminals.
- Concerns about the length of enterprise agreement negotiations in container terminals
 - Averaged 525 days (vs 295 days pre-2018)

Concerns about skills gaps and the training system

- Workers in many different roles are needed on Australia's ports.
- Where are the next generation of employees with blue water experience going to come from?
